The event's fundraising proceeds will help renovate the circa 1902 building. New windows are only one of the priorities, but with 142 windows that open and shut, it represents a major expense. The per-window naming right value is \$5,000.

THE BUILDING IS HISTORICALLY IMPORTANT FOR NUMEROUS REASONS. FOR EXAMPLE,

• It once housed Oklahoma's first newspaper, the Daily State Capital. When built, it was the largest dedicated printing

facility west of the Mississippi River; and

• The newspaper's coverage of how Oklahoma Territory would be opening up soon to new settlers inspired many people

to participate in the 1889 land run; and

• Most importantly, it was in this building in 1907 that a telegram from President Theodore Roosevelt was received

notifying Oklahoma Territory officials that Oklahoma statehood had been approved — and from the second-story

balcony statehood was announced to citizens of the new 47th state, Oklahoma.

IF WALLS COULD TALK

The State Capital Publishing Museum's architectural significance cannot be overstated. Designed by Belgian architect

Joseph Pierre Foucart—who drew up plans for several other prominent Guthrie buildings—it proudly serves today as a

unique example of early 20th century Oklahoma architecture and is a popular anchor in Guthrie's National Historic

Landmark District, the largest of its kind in the United States.

Today, the four-story, 40,000 square foot building still houses vintage printing presses and other historical items and

architectural details that are of significant importance to Oklahoma's history and need protecting for generations yet to

come. With this in mind, the museum's board of directors has created a strategic plan that features important steps for

restoring the building so it can reopen in the near future as a museum and multi-use facility. Restored, functional

windows are required prior to making a major investment in a new heating and air conditioning system.
